### the basics: having a baby

Lots of people with HIV have had babies without passing on the infection. To do so, you need some help from your doctor.

#### If you are a woman with HIV



#### If you are a man with HIV

Having unprotected sex with a woman who does not have HIV could give her HIV, and she could pass HIV on to the baby.

• If the mother does not have HIV, the baby won't have HIV. Also, HIV can't be passed directly from the father to the baby.

You can talk to your doctor about how risky unprotected sex would be for you at the moment – it varies from person to person.



• **Sperm washing'** is a process which removes HIV from sperm. It will allow your partner to get pregnant safely.



## **Important points**

In the UK, thousands of women with HIV have given birth to healthy babies. Medical help for HIV-positive mothers is widely available.

Medical support for fathers is not as widely available, but does exist.

 If you are thinking about having a baby, it's worth talking to your doctor at an early stage.



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
